## OUTREACH

Through our outreach program, Creating Hand-in-Hand, we provide art education, therapy, and experiences to underserved and vulnerable community members. We partner with 25+ organizations and agencies to fulfill this mission.



"JH Public Art started the Summer Art Mobile program in 2016. We brought free art activities to local neighborhoods and parks for children not enrolled in summer programming. Hole Food Rescue provided free, healthy food to local children and families and Teton Literacy provided free books through the Summer Art Mobile program. Last summer, JH Public Art collaborated with vibrant instructors from the Art Association's Creating Hand-in-Hand Outreach program to lead the art instruction and expand the art offerings to reach more children. **This vital partnership provided enriching experiences for over 700 youth.**"

# YOUTH PROGRAMS



In 2019 innovative new programs including Toddler into Art, Family Art, and Homeschool Art reached new youth demographics in our community.

Afterschool programming continued to serve students in grades K-12; students explored ceramics, digital photography, painting, sewing, and much more.

Middle and High School students studied printmaking intensively through The Studio Project, in partnership with the National Museum of Wildlife Art. Students explored the museum collection and then received studio instruction.

41 summer camp sessions kept our team busy! Camps in partnership with Dancers' Workshop, the Jackson Hole Land Trust, Off Square Theatre, Riot Act, and other local nonprofits created unique cross-disciplinary experiences.
