YOUTH PROGRAMS

Despite the challenges of 2020, many youth programs were offered for the local community.

Afterschool programming safely served students in grades K-12; students explored Printmaking, Painting & Drawing, Ceramics and Graphic Design.



Middle school students enjoyed drawing, painting, and throwing in the winter of 2020. High School students learned iPad Art & Design in the fall.

11 weeks of exciting summer camp sessions were held: two Plein Air sessions, a partnership with The Riot Act, and camps in Liquid, Paper, Kinetic, Sculpture and Fiber Arts. We offered specialty camps as well: Fantasy Home Design, Cardboard Camp, Stop-Motion Animation and Large Scale Paintings.

We love being able to use the great outdoors and our beautiful scenery for safety by offering classes on the center lawn, in addition to using our open air studios. During the summer months, we open the massive windows and let the outside in.

Anything's Possible


The exhibition was curated by Art Association Board member, Agnes Bourne, and presented in coordination with the Center for the Arts featured 23 local and regional artists.


