# YOUTH PROGRAMS

The Art Association proudly continued to provide vital and creative art-making programs for local and visiting youth of all ages throughout 2021.

Camp-style programs during Spring Break were offered for both grades K-1 and 2-5 students. After school classes were offered for students in grades K-12 in the winter, spring, and fall. Students explored mixed media, ceramics, digital illustration, printmaking, woodworking, painting, and drawing.

Eleven weeks of exciting summer camp sessions were also held. Grades K-2 students enjoyed: Literary, Liquid, Sculpture, Kinetic, Plein Air, Nature and Cardboard art camps, to name a few. Upper elementary youth explored: Fantasy Home Design, Sculpture,

Eurekus STEAM, Fiber Arts, Plein Air, Large Scale Paintings and Cardboard art camps. Middle and high school students experienced filmmaking, stop-motion animation and Dungeons & Dragons drawing camp.

Dynamic summer camp collaborations occurred between the Art Association and Dancers' Workshop, Riot Act, Inc., Teton Music School, JH Public Art, the Center for the Arts, Friends of Pathways and Off Square Theatre Company.

We utilized all five of our amazing studios and held classes on The Center lawn. The summer months allowed us to open windows and let the outside in.

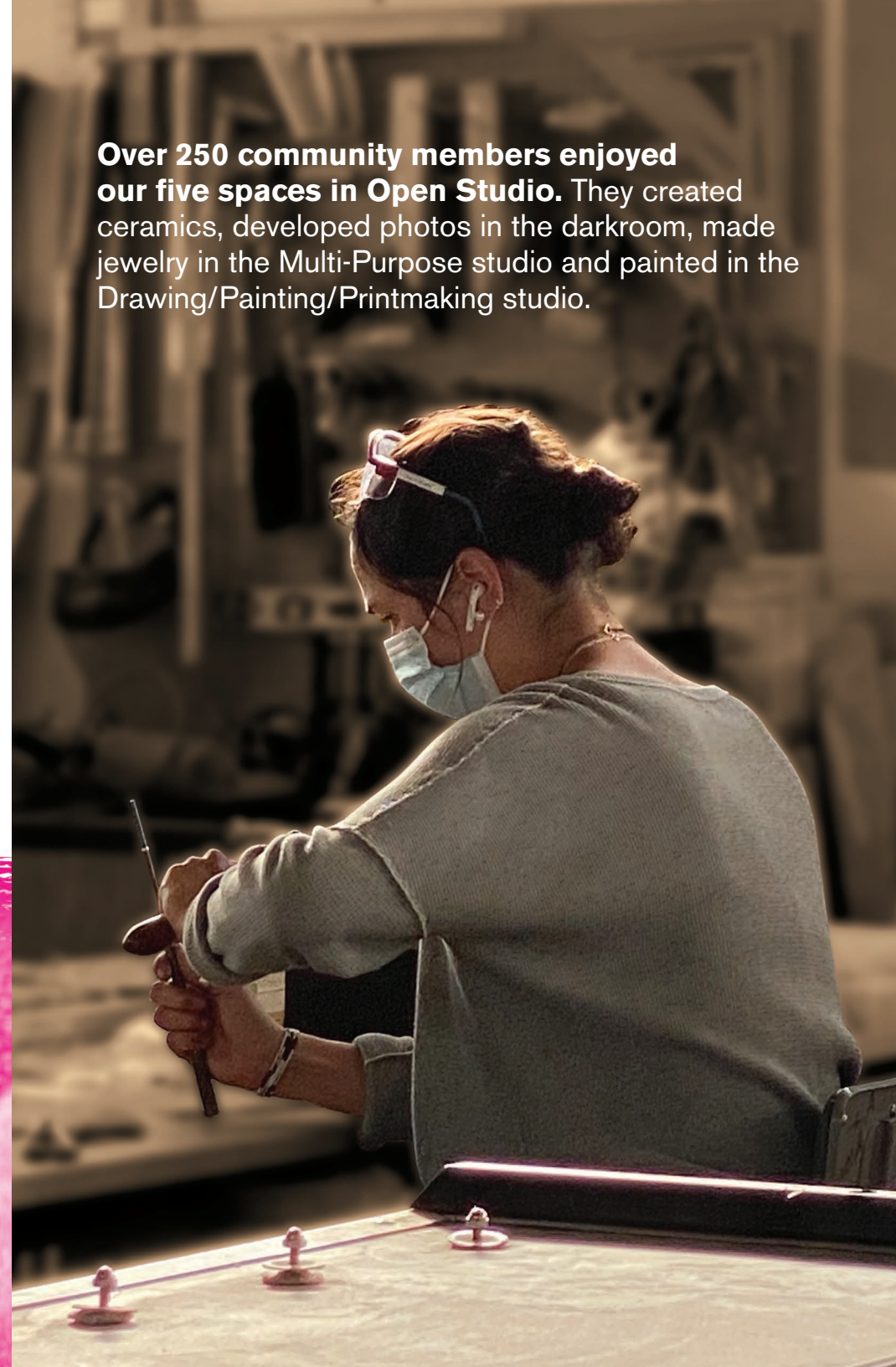
