YOUTH CLASSES & CAMPS

The Art Association of Jackson Hole proudly provided vital and creative art-making programs for local children of all ages throughout 2023.



After school classes were offered for children ages 5-18 in the winter, spring and fall.

Students explored mixed media, ceramics, digital illustration, drawing & painting, design and printmaking.

We offered two, one-week-long Spring Break Camps.

An Art Explorers camp was enjoyed by grades K-2 in the Children's Art Studio and was taught by an AmeriCorps Service Member. The grades 3-5 Character Creation camp took place with a veteran instructor in the Painting/Drawing/Printmaking Studio.

Ten weeks of exciting summer camp sessions were also held.

Grades K-2 students participated in Mixed Media Makers, Space Adventures, Toys & Games, Plein Air,

Arts Sampler, Creative Construction, Modern Art Marvels, Time Travelers, Literary Art, Liquid Art, and Large Scale Paintings camps. Grades 3-5 students participated in Fantasy Home Design, Cardboard, Plein Air, Modern Art Marvels, Stop Motion, and Photography camps. Middle and high school participated in Plein Air, Photography, Sew Much Fun, and Outdoor Mosaic camps.

Dynamic summer camp collaborations were presented

with the Teton Music School, Riot Act Inc., Dancers' Workshop, and Off Square Theatre Company.

All five studios were utilized, and instructors regularly enjoyed taking kids onto The Center Lawn.
